



# Haldjas

'Haldjas' means 'Fairy' in Estonian. This cowl is so soft and lacy that it just looks like fairytale to me. So that's where the name came from.

**Size:** one size

**Material:** aran weight mohair and/or angora blend. I used 2 skeins of mohair blend that's 50 g = 100 m (109 yards). All together I used 200 m / 218 yards of yarn. Just in case have a little extra because it depends on your gauge how much you will need. If you want to make the cowl longer you will need more yarn.

One stitch marker is required as well.

**Gauge:** 14 sts = 10 cm / 4" (in lace pattern)

**Needle size:** 5 mm / US 8 circulars (maximum 70 cm/28")

**Pattern notes:**

Cowl is knitted in a round. Charts display only odd rounds. All even rounds are knit in stockinette.

K – Knit

P – Purl

YO - Yarn over

K2Tog – Knit 2 together

SKP – Slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit, pass the slipped stitch over

**Directions:**

Cast on 120 sts. Join in round. Be careful not to twist. Mark the beginning of the round.

Round 1: P1, K1, repeat to the end.

Round 2: K1, P1, repeat to the end.

Round 3: P1, K1, repeat to the end.

Start with lace chart.

Work the chart until the cowl is in desired length. Mine is 41 cm / 16". Repeat first 3 rounds. Bind off loosely.

**Finishing:**



Weave in the ends. Wash the cowl and block it – that will make the stitches look more even and overall the cowl will look nicer.
