

I have charisma

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Size: women small
Material: I used Idena Bambino Ull. Take whatever yarn that gives you the needed gauge. It takes about 160 meters / 175 yards of yarn
Also some stitch holders and scrap yarn are required.
Gauge: 30 sts = 10 cm / 4"
Needle size: 2.25 mm (US 1) double pointed needles (or other size for getting the right gauge)

Pattern notes:

K – Knit P – Purl YO - Yarn over K2Tog – Knit 2 together SKP – Slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit, pass the slipped stitch over PSSO - pass slipped stitch over Sl - slip

Directions:

<u>Cuff:</u>

Cast on 44 sts. Mark the beginning of the round. Join the stitches into round. Divide stitches between 4 needles so that needles 1 and 3 have 12 stitches and needles 2 and 4 have 10 stitches. Rounds 1: Purl Round 2: *K2tog, YO*

Round 3: Purl

Knit 4 rounds then repeat rounds 1-3 once more.

Knit 4 rounds.

Follow the chart on needles 1 and 2. Continue in stockinette on needles 3 and 4. Note that chart depicts all the rounds.

Continue that way until you've reached to the round 15 on the chart. It's time to start thumb increases. Increases for thumb begin on needle 3 or 4 (depending on the hand). On needles 1 and 2 continue with the chart.

Increases for thumb: Right glove: Increases are made on the third needle. Round 1: K 1, YO, knit to the end of round. Round 2: K 1, knit YO twisted, knit to the end of round. Round 3: K2, YO, knit to the end of round. Round 4: K2, knit YO twisted, knit to the end of round. Round 5: K3, YO, knit to the end of round. Round 6: K3, knit YO twisted, knit to the end of round. Round 7: K4, YO, knit to the end of round.



Round 8: K4, knit YO twisted, knit to the end of round. Round 9: K5, YO, knit to the end of round. Round 10: K5, knit YO twisted, knit to the end of round. Round 11: K6, YO, knit to the end of round. Round 12: K6, knit YO twisted, knit to the end of round. In total you will have 6 sts increased. s

Left glove:

Increases are made on the fourth needle. Round 1: knit until 1 sts remains on the needle, YO, K 1. Round 2: knit until you get to YO stitch, knit YO twisted, K 1. Round 3: knit until 2 sts remains on the needle, YO, K2. Round 4: knit until you get to YO stitch, knit YO twisted, K2. Round 5: knit until 3 sts remains on the needle, YO, K3. Round 6: knit until you get to YO stitch, knit YO twisted, K3. Round 6: knit until 4 sts remains on the needle, YO, K4. Round 8: knit until you get to YO stitch, knit YO twisted, K4. Round 9: knit until 5 sts remains on the needle, YO, K5. Round 10: knit until you get to YO stitch, knit YO twisted, K5. Round 11: knit until 6 sts remains on the needle, YO, K6. Round 12: knit until you get to YO stitch, knit YO twisted, K6. In total you will have 6 sts increased.

Both hands:

After increases knit stockinette on needles 3 and 4 until you reach to the round 29 on the chart. Now it's time for thumb opening.

Thumb opening

For the right glove thumb opening is done on the third needle, for the left one on the fourth needle. At the same time continue chart on needles 1 and 2.

Right:

K 8 stitches with scrap yarn. Put those stitches back to the left needles and now reknit them with glove yarn. Knit to the end of round.

Left:

K until 8 sts remain on the needle. K 8 stitches with scrap yarn. Put those stitches back to the left needles and now reknit them with glove yarn.



Both hands:

Now you have placed thumb opening. Continue with stockinette on needles 3 and 4 and with chart on needles 1 and 2. On the next round after making the thumb opening decrease 3 stitches above the scrap yarn. This is needed to make glove fit better.

Continue until you finish the chart. Try the glove on. You want to pick up the thumb stitches for that to see the actual fit. See thumb section on how to do it. If it's time to do small finger opening then move to the section for that. If you finish chart before the time for small finger opening continue in stockinette on all the needles. I continued stockinette for 4 rounds.

After making small finger opening continue in stockinette for 3 more rounds because small finger starts lower than the rest of the fingers. After finishing those 3 rounds move to section that describes making other fingers.

Small finger opening

Try the glove on. Now see how many stitches naturally are around your small finger. Place those stitches on stitch holder. I placed 11 sts. Cast on 2 stitches in place of the stitches you put on holder. Continue to knit in round for 3 rounds (as mentioned above).

Now you can start knitting the fingers. For small finger I knit 15 sts in round and for other fingers 17 sts. Guidelines for fingers are below.

<u>Thumb</u>

Pick up the stitches above and below the scrap yarn. Remove scrap yarn. Pick up 2 stitches from both sides. For total you should have about 20 sts after picking up the stitches. You can pick up more stitches to avoid holes. In that case on the first round after picking up you just need to do some K2Togs so that you will have correct number of sts. I prefer to do decreases with the stitches that are above the thumb opening – there the decreases are the least visible.

After picking up stitches divide the sts between 3 needles (6-7-7) and continue in stockinette. Again, the best method for deciding when to start decreases for finishing the thumb is to try the glove on. When your nail is almost covered it is the best time to start decreasing.

Decreasing:

Decrease on all the needles using k2tog so that they all have 4 stitches left. Next round knit in stockinette. Then k2tog all the stitches. You will have 6 stitches remaining. Cut the yarn leaving a small tail. Pull the tail through all the remaining stitches. Thumb finished!

<u>Small finger</u>

For small finger you need 15 sts. Place the sts on stitch holder onto 2 needles. Pick up the additional required number of stitches from the opening. No problem if you need to pick up more stitches for avoiding holes. On the next round you will decrease the additional stitches. I suggest to place the decreases to the area that is between the fingers – there they are the least visible. Your sts will divide as 5-5-5. Continue in stockinette. Decreasing: Follow the instructions for thumb.



<u>Other fingers</u>

Start knitting from the second or fourth finger. You need 17 sts for a finger. Try the glove on and see how many stitches on both sides naturally place around your finger. These are the stitches you will use for that finger. Place other stitches onto 2 stitch holders (one for front stitches and the other one for back stitches).

Place finger stitches from front to one needle and from back to the second needle. Now see how many additional stitches you need. Those you need to cast on to the third needle. Divide the stitches between 3 needles (6-6-5 sts). Continue in stockinette. Decreases: follow the instructions for the thumb.

Middle finger.

Try the glove on again to see which stitches naturally place around the middle finger. Place those sts to the needles. See how many additional sts you need. Pick up the sts from the edge of the finished finger. Cast on at least one sts on the other side in the area between fingers. That will avoid the twisting of the stitches around your fingers. Continue to follow the instructions for the previous finger.

Remaining finger.


Place the remaining sts on needles. Pick up the required amount of sts from the edge of the neighbor finger. Continue to follow the instructions for the previous finger.

Finishing

Weave in the ends. Wash the gloves and block them - that will make the stitches look more even and overall the gloves will look nicer
