

Joon

'Joon' means 'Line' in Estonian. As you can see this hat has some stripes that are spiced up with some slipped stitches.

Size: one size

Material: : I used Idena Bambino Ull (50 g = 175 m). Takes about 90 m / 99 yards of main color (MC) and 70 m / 77 yards of contrasting color (CC). Also 1 stitch marker is required. **Gauge:** 23 sts = 10 cm / 4" **Needle size:** 3 mm (US 2.5) circular needles (50 cm/20") and double pointed needles (or other size for getting the right gauge)

Pattern notes:

K – Knit
P – Purl
SI – slip stitch purlwise
K2Tog – Knit 2 together
Twisted rib – instead of usual knit stitch knit through back loop. Purl stitches are as usual.
MC - main color
CC - contrasting color

Directions:

Cast on 116 sts with your main color. Join in round. Be careful not to twist. Mark the beginning of the round. Knit 8 rounds in 1 k - 1 p twisted rib. Knit 1 round in stockinette and increase evenly to 126 stitches. Knit one more round in stockinette. Switch to contrasting color. Round 1-3. K3, Sl 1, K2. Repeat from the beginning until the end of the round. Round 4-6. Knit Switch to main color. Round 7-9. Sl 1, K5. Repeat from the beginning until the end of the round. Round 10-12. Knit Continue until you have 4 stripes in contrasting color and your hat measures about 16 cm / 6.25". If your hat doesn't measure as much as required yet continue in MC in stockinette until required length. Switch to MC. Knit one round. Now decreasing starts. *K16, K2Tog*. Continue until the end of round. Knit 3 rounds. *K15, K2Tog*. Continue until the end of round. Knit 2 rounds.

K14, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

Knit 1 round.

K13, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

Knit 1 round.

K12, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

Knit 1 round.

K11, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

Knit 1 round.

K10, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

Knit 1 round.

Now start decreasing on every round. You can switch to double pointed needles if it's uncomfortable to continue knitting with circular needle.

K9, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K8, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K7, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K6, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K5, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K4, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K3, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K2, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K1, K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

K2Tog. Continue until the end of round.

You will have 7 sts on needles. Break the yarn and pull the end through all the stitches.

Finishing:

Weave in the ends. Wash the hat and block it – that will make the stitches look more even and overall the hat will look nicer.
