

Kevad

The name of this hat ,Kevad' means ,Spring' in Estonian. I named the pattern so because I'm hoping that it brings spring closer.

Size: one size

Material: Takes about 150 m / 165 yards of sport weight yarn. I used Steinbach Wolle Capri.
Also 1 stitch marker is required.
Gauge: 20 sts = 10 cm / 4"
Needle size: 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles (50 cm/20") and double pointed needles (or other size for getting the right gauge)

Pattern notes:

K – Knit P – Purl P2Tog – Purl 2 together K2Tog – Knit 2 together YO – yarn over SKP – Slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit, pass the slipped stitch over Psso – pass the slipped stitch over Twisted rib – instead of usual knit stitch knit through back loop. Purl stitches are as usual.

Directions:

Cast on 102 sts. Join in round. Be careful not to twist. Mark the beginning of the round. Knit 8 rounds in 1k-1p twisted rib.

Knit 1 round and at the same time increase evenly 26 sts. You will have 128 sts in total.

Start lace pattern from chart 1. Knit rounds 1-24. Then knit again rounds 1-12. Start with chart 2.

Switch to double pointed needles if it's not comfortable to knit with circular anymore.

When finished with chart 2 then p2tog one more round.

Break the yarn and pull the end through all the stitches. Block the hat and you're finished!
