



# Uetliberg

*Uetliberg is a hill in Zürich that I see from my balcony. It's the usual place for me to go for a walk and in wintertime it's nice to wear all your warm knits at those walks. This hat is one of my constant companions on Uetliberg.*

**Size:** one size

**Material:** 2 colors of sport-weight yarn, recommended is alpaca or its blend, main color 110 meters / 125 yards, contrasting color 50 meters / 55 yards

**Gauge:** 24 sts = 10 cm / 4" with bigger needles.

**Needle size:** 3.5 mm (US 4) and 4 mm (US 6) size circular needles (50 cm / 20") (or other size for getting the right gauge) and 4 mm double pointed needles

**Pattern notes:**

K – Knit

P – Purl

YO - Yarn over

K2Tog – Knit 2 together

SKP – Slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit, pass the slipped stitch over

**Directions:**

Cast on 104 sts with contrasting color and smaller needles. Join in round. Be careful not to twist. Mark the beginning of the round.

Round 1: k1, p1

Round 2: knit

Repeat rounds 1 and 2 four more times.

Switch to bigger needles and main color.

Knit one round, increasing at the same time evenly to 124 sts. Knit 2 more rounds.

Start knitting the chart. Repeat the chart 2 times and then once more the rounds 1-8 of the cart.

Continue with main color. Knit 1 round.

Next round: k8, k2tog, repeat until you have 4 stitches left, knit until the end of round. You should have 112 stitches on the needles.

Knit 1 round.

Knit rounds 7-8 of the chart.

Continue with main color. Knit 1 round.

Next round: k5, k2tog, repeat until the end of round. You should have 96 stitches on the needles.

Knit 1 round.

Knit rounds 1-2 of the chart.

Continue with main color. Knit 1 round.

Next round: k6, k2tog, repeat until the end of round. You should have 84 stitches on the needles.

Knit 1 round.

Knit rounds 7-8 of the chart.

Continue with main color. Knit 1 round.



Next round: k2, k2tog, repeat until the end of round. You should have 63 stitches on the needles.

Knit 3 rounds.

Next round: k1, k2tog, repeat until the end of round. You should have 42 stitches on the needles.

Knit 2 rounds.

Next round: k2tog, repeat until the end of round.

Knit 1 round

Next round: k2tog, repeat until you have 1 stitch left on the needle, k1.

Break the yarn and pull the end through all the stitches.

**Finishing:**

Weave in the ends. If you want you can embellish the gloves with needle felting, embroidery or crochet motifs. Wash the gloves and block them – that will make the stitches look more even and overall the gloves will look nicer.
